**Scientific Name:** *Halesia tetraptera*

**Common Name:** Carolina silverbell

**Hardiness Zones:** 4–8

**Habit:** 40–30 feet tall by 20–35 feet wide

**Growth Rate:** Medium

**Form:** Broad round crown

**Foliage:** Deciduous, 2–5 inches long, alternate, simple, oval; yellow green in summer with yellow fall color

**Flowers:** White bell-shaped flowers in spring followed by curious winged brown fruits
